

Georgia Attorney J. B. Stoner, the head of the ultra right-wing National States Rights Party, says he has been asked by the U.S. Labor Party to join forces throughout the South.

Stoner claims he turned down a request from U.S. Labor Party leaders that the two parties should merge their organizing efforts in order to have more political influence.

Stoner adds, however, that U.S. Labor Party officials and Col. Tom McCrary, the head of the American Independent Party in Georgia, have, in effect, combined their forces.

According to Stoner, the U.S. Labor Party is now working with members of the white citizens' councils, the Ku Klux Klan and similar groups throughout the South.

The U.S. Labor Party in recent years has become one of the most politically active groups in America. The party is currently crusading in favor of expanding nuclear power and is lobbying against passing more lenient pot laws.
